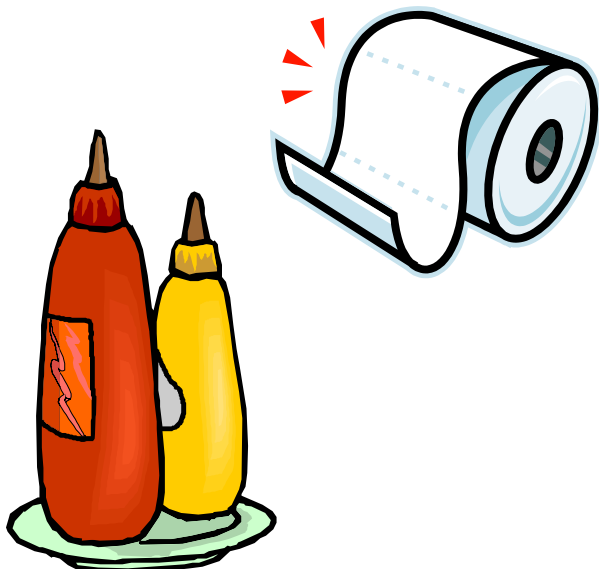
Food Bank Needs Donations

This is not new, believe me it goes way back even before our childhoods (maybe not all). Thousands of years. Back then everyone

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knew that on a certain day everyone went to market, just because. We nearly lost markets in many communities for a great many years but the same old thing keeps popping up (until some idiot figures out a way to tax it). We need this or that and don't have a good supplier. If the need is there, and you have the product, people will come. Now we get to Advanced Marketing 101. Somewhere along the line people forgot how good fresh produce was, how great it was to talk to friends and neighbors, just bs for a while. The trick is to get people back into the habit of coming to the market, "Our Friday Market". It kind of works like this - you tell them what you are going to tell them, you tell them, and then you tell them what you told them then you go back and check to see that the hearing aids were turned on. **WE NEED OUR FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS AT "OUR FRIDAY MARKET"**. Without people the market will die.

Many of our vendors are from the other side of the pond, Whidbey Island, eastern Washington, even far away places like the other end of the bridge. The Bell Street Bakery is from way out West in Sequim. It costs them money to come to Port Ludlow, If they don't sell they won't be back. A great many of our vendors know that there are going to be a few bad days, that happens but they need your support to keep coming every week. To some this is their livelihood. To others it is a hobby, it keeps them out of the bars and off the streets, (that's what I claim).

We have a very good thing going, remember that old adage, darn, forgot it.

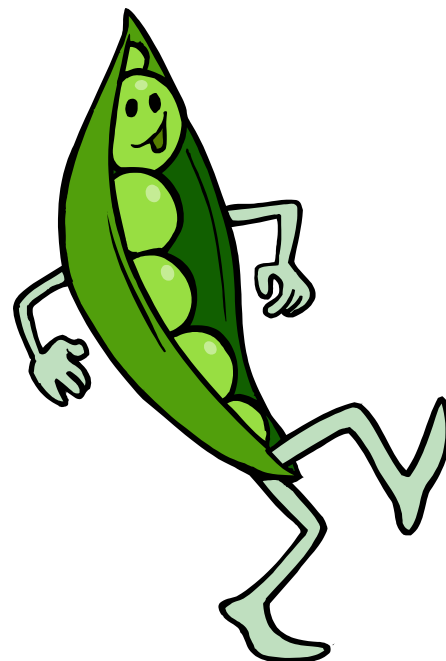
